ROBBED ON HIGHWAY

A. T. Alexander was robbed Thursday night of last week on the highway east of Giddings, about two miles out. He was driving home from the day's work, and as he slowed down the truck he was driving, some one stepped on the running board, switched off Alexander's lights and demanded that he get out of the truck. A pistol was punched into his left side to cause him to hurry up. As he was in the act of getting off the seat the stranger's hand was run into the right hand pocket of the overalls which A. T. was wearing and all the currency which he had, amounting to \$20, was taken. The act was done so quickly that he could not tell how many there were in the party. The other automobile was driving behind the Alexander truck, with their lights cut off, and when they left, they speeded away without turning on their lights.
