**WOOL PRODUCTION**

Adolph Behrens drove into town last Saturday with two sacks of wool which he had clipped from 40 sheep, a total of 215 lbs. The price of wool is generally about twice the price of cotton, but the price has been poor of late, because much wool has been selling for less than what was advanced on it by the co-operatives last year. Adolph says it is not much trouble to care for the sheep, so the price of an extra bale of cotton is good money at this time of the year.
