They placed the furniture in the yard, closed the house and padlocked the front door. A printed sign was nailed on the front wall near the door, which read:

CLOSED

for Violation of the National Prohibition Act by order of the U. S. District Court, Western District of Texas. All persons forbidden to enter premises without order from U. S. Marshall. Scott C. White,

Quite a crowd gathered while the procedure was going on, and the furniture was promptly moved away by truck by a citizen. The place is owned by Alvin Bohot.
