## Teacher Honored.

The Tenth Anniversary of Prof. R. G. Buuck as teacher of Trinity Lutheran Selfool of Fedor was observed by that Church in its regular evening services Sunday night. Mr. Buuck came to Fedor as the second teacher of the Christian Day School in the fall of 1931, and has thus completed a decade of service. He is a graduate of the Luth. Normal College at River Forest, Illinois.

After the services an informal reception was given Prof. and Mrs. Buuck by members of the church. Trinity Choir sang two anthems in their honor. The young people entertained with volley ball. He takes an active part in the work with the youth organization of the church, the Walther League Society, and also promotes 4-H clubs and similar organizations. The young people thanked him especially for the interest he has shown in their behalf.

Trinity Lutheran School opened its fall session Monday. Rev. A. F. Michalk spoke to teachers and pupils on the Words of Psalm CXXVII: "Except the Lord build the house, they labor in vain that build it; except the Lork keep the city, the watchman waketh but in vain. It is vain for you to rise up early, to sit up late, to cat the bread of sorrows: for so he giveth his beloved sleep."

Trinity School has also introduced the VIII grade this fall in conformity with the new system adopted in Texas schools. Prof. Theodore Schroeder, principal of the school for the past 17 years, presides over the upper grades in which 35 pupils are enrolled. The lower grades, under Prof. Buuck, thus far number 32 pupils. A number of graduates from the school are now attending the Giddings High School. Two young men, Roland Schroeder and Edwin Pillack, graduates of former years are preparing as normal students in Concordia Academy at Austin. Arnold Zschech left or A. & M. College last week. Theodore Michalk, a student of Concordia Seminary at St. Louis, left for that institution Sunday, after occupying his father's pulpit in the morning services.
