COUNTRY HOME BURNS

The Alfred Fuchs home one mile southwest of Paige burned last Friday morning. The fire was discovered about 8 o'clock in the second story near the kitchen flue and the high wind soon fanned the flames to where they were beyond control. Farm neighbors and town people from Paige rushed there but could not do any thing toward saving any of the contents of the building. Only a few articles were saved. Had the wind been in another direction, the large barns and sheds would also have burned. The home was a large country home and had been added to last summer when the son Erich was married and was making his home with his parents. Mrs. Fuchs collapsed for a while during the fire, but was soon revived.
