He never favored the open saloon and does not favor its return. He favors government control of liquor just like the food supply was controlled during the wartime. He favors cash payment of the adjusted compensation to world-war veterans. He opposes cancellation of foreign debts owed to the U. S. He promises, if elected, a careful study of all economic measures introduced in the House instead of "gallery applause" and to give first consideration to benefits to be derived by his constituents. He favors a more economic distribution of wealth, deplores the drifting into centralization. He is an old-time Democrat, was born in La Grange May 13, 1877 and has worked his way up from the bottom to a place in the business world where he is today.
