Cases Against T. Jank Dismissed

E. T. Simmang received a telegram Wednesday from Austin to the effect that the higher court had dismissed the relator (Jank) in the appeals case which they had just passed on. There were several cases against Jank for refusing to dip his live stock last year and his attorney Mr. Simmang took an appeal attacking the validity of the penal portion of the tick eradication law as it applied to Lee County prior to Jan. 1, 1922. Jank had been tried and convicted in five cases in justice and county courts, and the effect of the decision at Austin dismisses the cases against him.
