## Six Persons Injured In Accident Near Carmine

In a truck—auto collision 3 miles west of Carmine Saturday night, six people were injured and were rushed to hospitals for treat ment.

Clyde Jones of Phillips and Luckey Company, accompanied by Anton Bethke and Rubin Schneider were on their way to Beaumont and were some of the first on the scene of the wreck. They assisted in rushing the injured to the Lee Memorial Hospital and Brenham Hospital. Other ambulances rushed to the scene to take the injured to the hospital

A truck driven by Raymond Steinbach of Carmine and a new Ford car figured in the collision. Steinbach suffered severe head injuries which at first it was feared might prove fatal, but his condition is reported much improved at Lee Memorial.

The Ford was occupied by Mr. and Mrs. Carl Urban and daughter Dorothy Lee, and Mr. and Mrs Edwin Urban, all of Houston. Mr. Bethke first learned at the hospital that the two men were cousins of Mrs. Bethke. They were on the way to visit their mother Mrs. Henry Urban at Manheim. All except the little girl were painfully injured.

After all the injured had been taken care of, Mr. Jones, Mr. Bethke and Mr. Schnetder resumed their drive in the ambulance to Beaumont.
