Austin, Texas, July 14 — 1953 (Special) — State Bar President Everett L. Looney has announced the appointment of several lawyers of the 10th Congressional District as members of district grivance committees of the State Bar of Texas.

Purpose of the committees, as explained by Looney, is to investigate alleged cases of professional misconduct and establish better understanding between clients and attorneys. Aggrieved clients may make complaints against lawyers and be assured of a fair and impartial hearing.
