

## Two Lee County Boys Win in San Antonio Calf Scramble

Robert Don Faske of Giddings was one of the lucky winners in the calf scramble held during the third rodeo performance at the San Antonio Livestock Exposition.

He placed first in his go-around and won a purchase certificate worth \$50.

Charles E. Knobloch of Lincoln was one of the lucky winners in the calf scramble held during the first rodeo performance at the San Antonio Livestock Exposition.

He placed third in his go-around and won a purchase certificate worth \$15.

During all but one of the 15 performances of the Everett Colbern World's Championship rodeo, 20 boys are scrambling to catch 10 calves in the arena.

Armed with a halter attached to a 10-foot rope, each boy must try to catch and halter a calf, then drag him back across the finish line. Once he has caught the calf, no other boy may touch it unless it breaks away, or, if he catches it by the tail and can not place the halter in a reasonable length of time, he'll be directed by the referee to let go.

Prizes are purchase certificates for livestock ranging from the top award of \$50 down to the sixth through tenth prizes of \$15.

These certificates must be used in the purchase of livestock to be used as their 4-H or FFA project, and title to the livestock passes to the boy after he has demonstrated his interest in caring for it and his ability to follow competent instructions in raising it.

The stock show will continue through Feb. 27.
