

LCRA Employees Receive Safety Awards

Awards for achieving outstanding safe working records were presented on Jan. 5 to employees of distribution line crews working out of the Giddings office of the Lower Colo-

rado River Authority.

The employees of this division worked the entire year of 1955 without a lost-time accident, W. S. Gideon, LCRA general manager, announced.

The employees received a certificate of merit for their record. The supervisor, George Krenek, was given a special award. In addition, awards were made to three foremen, H. L. Snow, W. A. Schulz, and T. C. Whitsel.

Three employees received the "Five Year Safe Worker" award for having no lost-time accidents since 1950. They are Henry Hohlt, Alexander Toppel, and W. O. Urban.

The Giddings crew was one of 16 groups of LCRA employees who had no lost-time accidents in 1955. Over-all, the LCRA achieved an accident frequency rate of only 5.33.
