DIME BOX BOY WINS HONORS

The Dime Box Chapter of Future Farmers of America boasts of having a State Farmer, better known in Texas as a Lone Star Farmer. Mr. A. C. Harzke, instructor of vocational agriculture in the Dime Box high school and Frank Kubena, graduate of 1940, went to the state convention at Marshall, Texas, where Frank received the degree of Lone Star Farmer.

Frank has done a good job of growing into farming. He has been a member of the F. F. A. since the work has been in the Dime Box school in 1937. He completed the three years of affiliated Vocational Agriculture and since graduation has remained an active member.

In the four years of supervision, Frank is proud to show the following report of his program of work.

Expenses \$953.26; credit \$1502.78; net profit \$556.70; self-labor \$105.50. Labor income as earnings, or productive enrichment \$662.20. This is an excellent record considering that the financial requirement to become a Lone Star Farmer is to earn or productively invest \$250.00. Along with his earnings he must have established a good scholastic average, shown qualities of leadership and acted as an officer in the local F. F. A. Chapter.

Lee County is proud of Frank's record because he is not only the first Lone Star	Farmer of the Dime Box chapter, but also the first boy in Lee County to receive this honor.
