

## Lehman Funeral Chapel to Have Opening Sunday

Sunday will mark the opening of the completely modern Lehman Funeral Chapel to be operated by Mr. and Mrs. Henry G. Lehman and Henry W. Lehman.

The funeral chapel is located in the two story former residence of the late John Lehman, father of Henry W. Lehman, and is on the same block as the Henry W. Lehman residence which was destroyed by fire on Christmas eve 1941.

The building was completely remodeled for this purpose including a spacious chapel with folding chairs, that have spring cushioned seats. The floor is covered with carpet from wall to wall. A very attractive feature is a large family room. The windows and casket background are covered with beautiful burgundy draperies.

Adjoining the chapel is the music room, which is equipped with a beautiful two-manual electric Hammond organ and the room is furnished with modern tan leather furniture and aqua draperies. This room may also be used as a reception room.

Among other rooms in the house is a complete embalming room and a modern display room.

The new funeral chapel is conveniently located in the residential section seven blocks east of the downtown traffic light and
