Mr. J. H. Patschke of Fedor was in one day last week and stated that about all of the early peanut crop in his section was a total loss. It rained daily for about three weeks with no sunshine and the vines and nuts which had been plowed out and left in the fields to dry had rotted. The hay will not be fit for use. Later crops of peanuts will do well with the sunshine but the total peanut crop for the county will be much less on account of the September wet weather.
