mained in that condition until next morning about 5 o'clock he showed some signs of coming to, but it was about 11 o'clock before he fally realized what had happened and then he fold not know and sked some of the logs what was the matter. It seems

he received a serere blow on the back of his head resulting in a prefty bad out or two as well as being considerbly bruised otherwise. At times he suffers more than other and the Drs.

have been watching his case very closely. It is not exactly known just, how badly he is hurt, but it is sincerely hoped nothing more or worse than has already shown up.
