BAD ACCIDENT

Christian Seelke of Giddings was near Taylor Sunday on his way to work on a farm, near where he worked last year. He and his brother Carl were walking along the road 3 miles from Taylor and an automobile stopped to pick them up, after asking them if they wanted a ride. As the Seelkes were going around the automobile to get in on the left side, an oil truck came from the direction the passenger car was facing, and Carl jumped without being hit.

Christian was hit by the bumper just below his right knee, breaking the leg. His left arm was badly injured and his face bruised when he struck the ground. The truck driver and the driver of the automobile placed Christian in the car and rushed him to the hospital in Taylor where he is. Christian is a son of Mr. and Mrs. Herman Seelke, sexton of the Giddings cemetery, and is a hard working young man. The accident is regretted by all concerned, and it is hoped that he will speedily recover. Mrs. Seelke, Otto, Frieda and Olga Seelke visited him this week and Frieda will remain there to see him at nights.
