Diesel Oil Engine Unloaded

An oil engine of the Diesel type was unloaded Monday for Ernst Weiser's gin at Fedor. The engine weighs 9,000 lbs and cost \$4,000. It is 80 horse power and runs on crude oil or any other combustible. It is the new type of engines that are being used in many of the big plants and doubtless in a few more years oil burning engines will displace the wood burners especially in gins on account of the saving in time. Ad. Wachmann moved the engine by loading it on a wagon and pulling it with a tractor.
