He was on the other side of Hills F when it bappened and the gentleman who was with him could not drive the auto they went out there in so Dick after wrapping his arm up the best he H could with his shirt got in the car and u drove it a mile or two with the other p hand until they reached Hills and Mr. 8 Will Mueller then got in and drove on to town. Reaching town there wasn't in a Dr. to be found. They were all out on calls. Mrs. Hettie Riebars rendered first ald service to him and Dr. Fleids said if there was anything ne round do he would gladly do it, but he examined the wound and said there were no hones broken and that a matter of an hour or two would not make any difference then as it had stopped baseding and that it would require surgery work on the wound and he wasn't prepared to do that kind of work. Dick was then put on a lonnge in the Drs. office and some thirty or forty minutes two Drs. Lame back to town and gave him proper attention. 110 did not rest very well the first night and has been reported as doing about as well as could be expected since. The wound was a very ugly one but Instance makanes were broken. The Dra had to take several stitches in sewing up the place.
