Blue Bell distributes ice ream from Taylor to Hunts-rille to Palacios, but the but the branch plant at Giddings seres mostly Lee County and ricinity. It buys cream locally, and makes butter right at the tation here. The butter churn vill hold 1000 pounds of but-er, and would cost at present prices \$4,000. Another piece of quipment, costing approxinately \$2,500, is the heating and cooling vat. There is also the \$7,500 vault and refrigeration unit.

The Blue Bell provides market for cream produced by Lee County farmers, and also a source of quality butter for consumers locally at a reason-able price. Wiese said butter was now wholesaling at 65 cents per pound, whereas it once sold, about two years ago, at 90 cents wholesale. The firm did buy whole milk, but they stopped that last year, because there was not enough of it available. They make both sweet gream butter and the sour cream variety.
