**LESDIE D. WILLIAMS
ANNOUNCES FOR
DISTRICT ATTORNEY**

To the Voters:

I have announced for the office of District Attorney of the 21st Judicial District which is composed of Bastrop, Burleson, Washington and Lee Counties. I was born near La Grange in Fayette County in 1892 and moved with my parents in 1894 to a farm near Smithville in Bastrop County, where I was raised. I received my primary education in the Smithville public schools and was graduated from Baylor University in 1914.

After graduation from Baylor, I taught in East Texas for three years, leaving this position to enter the First Officers Training Camp at Leon Springs in May 1917. I was commissioned Second Lieutenant at the close of the training period and assigned to the 90th Division with which Organization I served throughout the war, including 12 months in France. Was honorably discharged at the close of the War with the rank of Captain of Infantry. I now hold the rank of Lieutenant-Colonel of Infantry in the Reserve Corps of the U. S. Army and am assigned to the 90th Division.

After the close of the war, I taught school in the Breckenridge High School in San Antonio for three years, during which time I prepared for the Bar Examination by private study and was admitted to the Bar in June, 1923, and opened my office for the practice of law in Smithville, my home town. I have served as County Attorney of Bastrop County for six years and am now serving as County Judge of Bastrop County.

I shall be glad to give you any other information, and assure you that I shall appreciate your support and influence.
