To the People of Lee County:

In this issue of the Giddings News you will find my announcement as candidate for re-election to the office of County Judge of Lee County, subject to the action of the Democratic Primaries to be held on July 23, 1932.

I believe that a public officer is a servant of the people and that it is the unbounded duty to serve them from the smallest item to the largest.

I believe in reducing the expenses of the County as much as possible, so far as it is not injurious to the County.
