Taylor To Dedicate New Church. Install Pastor Sunday, May 21

REV. ZOCH ACCEPTS CALL TO CONGREGATION HE HIM- SELF ORGANIZED

Sunday, May 21, will mark a gala day in the annals of the newly organized Trinity Lutheran Church of Taylor, as not only their Church will be dedicated on that day, but also their pastor, the Rev. G. A. Zoch, organizer of the new congregation, will be installed.

Prof. Geo. Beto of Austin will deliver the installation sermon while the Rev. Zoch will dedicate the new church.

An Army hospital barrack building 25 x 75 remodeled will serve as temporary church building until a new church will be erected. The location is choice property — 6 large city lots donated by a member — Henry Werchan. The remodeling work was mostly volunteer service.

The mission at Taylor was started October 1949 by the Noack Church of which the Rev. G. A. Zoch was pastor.

The new church at Taylor numbered 65 souls at the start. Now it has 27 voting members, 90 communicants, and 127 souls. It has wonderful prospects to increase its membership as the population of Taylor exceeds 10,000.

Rev. Zoch, a native of Lee County, is well known here. Since his pastorage at Noack in October 1946, that church increased its membership from 220 to 350 members. He preached his farewell sermon at Noack on Mother's Day and will now reside with his family, his wife and two children, Glen Arthur and Anne Louise at Taylor.

Everyone is cordially invited to the installation and dedicatory services in Taylor Sunday. The service will begin at 2:30 p. m. The church is located at 800 Sloan Street, westend of Taylor.
