Mrs. Emma Gau Passes

Mrs. Emma Gau, 63, passed away suddenly at the home of her daughter and son-in-law, Mr. and Mrs. A. E. Keilers, on Friday, Oct. 27. Mrs. Gau was recuperating nicely from a broken knee cap that she suffered some six weeks ago, when she collapsed from a heart attack.

Mrs. Gau, nee Emma Citzler, was born near La Grange on Aug. 12, 1887, daughter of the late Emil and Clara Citzler. She married Aug. Gau on Dec. 16, 1909, and they lived in the Mecklenburg community. Her husband passed away on Feb. 15, 1937, from a heart attack also. Mrs. Gau then resided in La Grange and moved to Carmine about eight years ago.
