Funeral services were held Sunday afternoon at 2 p. m. from the Von Minden Funeral Chapel in Round Top, for Mrs. Henry Weber, 61, who passed away at her home Friday evening at 11:15 after a short illness.

Mrs. Weber, nee Frieda Marburger, was born Aug. 16, 1894, in Washington County, the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Edward Marburger. She was baptized December 6, 1894, by the Rev. Neuhardt of Round Top. On March 7, 1907, she was confirmed in the Lutheran faith by Rev. H. Weber at Haw Creek. On Dec. 15, 1915, she was united in marriage with Henry Weber in Haw Creek, with Rev. J. Boashardt performing the ceremony. They resided near Round Top and were farmers until in November 1946, they retired and moved to Carmine to make their home. The last two years Mrs. Weber was a seamstress, the work she did until a few hours before her death.

Mrs. Weber was a member of the Lutheran church nearly all her life and served the Lord faithfully, attending church regularly.
