On Good Friday we had a nice shower of rain, but not enough to saturate the thirsty ground; but let us hope that it will rain again soon. Nevertheless, the grains in this area are nicer than in some other areas. Since I was in The Grove area at Easter. I became aware, that it is also very dry there and the grain in The Grove is almost worse than here. The corn is pretty nice so far, the farmers are plowing quickly. Not much cotton has been planted currently, winter hay is nearly ready, but there won't be much hay if it stays dry for a long time.

The state of health is not the best to report since the measles are everywhere in this area. Almost everyone has been visited by the illness, but there are no deaths to report. All over in the surrounding areas you hear nothing but measles and measles again. The measles are not dangerous, nobody needs to be afraid. We also had the illness in this house.

On March 28th at night the big school-house in Gatesville Tex. burned down, which, as I heard, cost over 20 thousand dollars. The cause of the fire is not known as of now. Enough for this time until there is something again.
