Revival at Dime Box

The boys and girls enjoyed a story hour with Mrs. Weaver; the men and young men organized a laymen association with an initial en-rollment of 26, the main ser-xice being to further Chr st's Kingdom and enjoy good Chris-ian fellowship. The Christian women of the community else organized a Woman's Auxdiary with initial enrollment of 24. A model Christian Endenvor was held at 5 o'clock. Supper was enjoyed at six. Vesper services began at 7:45 followed by the evening ser. mon. In every way it was a most successful series of meetings, and Sunday a day long to be remembered.
