about an hour before he died and said the poisoning machine hit a stump, throwing him off in an opposite direction but he fell hitting violently, evidently on his spinal column and was instantly paralyzed from his waist down. The x-ray picture taken at the hospital showed his spinal column to be split. He was a world war veteran and was a little past 44 years old. He leaves to mourn his loss, his immediate family-- his wife, and 3 daughters, Mrs. Roy Stanley, Vera and Norma, and two sons, Wayne and Charles. A large crowd of relatives and friends attended the funeral service at the Presbyterian church here at 4 o'clock Friday afternoon, with Rev. Hooter of the Giddings Baptist Church, preaching the sermon. The Phillips - Luckey Burial Association had charge of the arrangements and interment was at the new cemetery near Dime Box.
