"Poultry Equipment" was her subject, stating, Dipping pits, 20 infrom the floor, are ideal for roosts. The best investment in poultry house is the money expended for a sufficient amount of carbolineum to paint the roosts and nests thoroughly. Mites and blue bugs will not harbor in these places then.

Range shelters are excellent for developing pullets. Feeders and waterers should be the size according to the size of the chicken. They should be off the ground so it will keep the feed and water clean.

A swinging coop is a handy piece of equipment to break up broody hens that have a tendency to set. As the eggs are hatching they should be candled twice. There are various types of candlers which can easily be made of light globes, tin cans, and boxes.
