I will send in a short report from Fedor again. On February 17, Private Arthur Iselt from Camp Howze, Gainsville, Texas, who was sick in the hospital for 3 weeks, came home. He had a bad cold for 3 weeks, and then he had pain in his side. After an examination by a doctor, he had to have an appendicitis operation.

He had the operation on February 2, and, with the help of God, he came safely through the operation. He received very good care throughout all of his sickness. At noon, on February 17, he came home to the surprise of his loved ones, who did not know that he could come home. There was great joy to see him again.

He had gotten 14 days of leave because of his long sickness. Then, on February 23, his birthday was celebrated. Since his brother, Leonard, was also 18 years old, he had to on that day also register for the service. In the evening, they had a delicious meal with all kinds of good things to eat, that tasted good to everyone. The time together went too fast, and soon all had to return home. Present for this occasion were: Henry Kalmbach and family, Alwin Winkler and family, Mr and Mrs. Oswald Iselt, Emil Patschke and family, Lorenz Tolkmitt and wife, Eleanor, Gotthilf, Hildegard and Herman Winkler.

On February 28, his uncle, Emil Patschke prepared a good noon meal for Alfred, so Private Albert was well hosted all around as long as he was home. He had to get on his trip back to Camp Howze on March 1. He left all of us again in Giddings around 5:30, since he had to be back in his camp by March 3.

Now, how is Uncle Ernst Weiser doing? I hope that he is still well. And what is Cousin Ottilie doing with her children? Hope they all are well. It would be nice if we could all be together once again. Greetings to all the relatives in Big Foot. Let us hear from you again.
