An Accident

An automobile turned over at one of the concrete culverts on the Giddings - Lincoln highway near C. D. Hurst's pasture. The car rolled down a steep embankment and fell bottom upwards, a total wreck. From the information that has been gained, two Negroes who live near Lexington but whose names have not been learned, were in the car. The driver was not experienced and he was going at a pretty good clip when the other occupant on the front seat became frightened at the speed and took hold of the steering wheel and held it so tightly that the driver could not steer the car. The right front wheel struck the concrete abutment on the left side of the bridge and the car went over. Much blood was spilled in and about the car and it was reported that one person got his leg broken.
