NEW LIBRARY TO BE OPENED

On the evening of Friday, April 29th, the Giddings Public Library will have its formal opening in its new quarters in the court house. The Giddings Study Club has sponsored a library for several years but has recently moved it to these new quarters and is busy getting things in readiness to serve this town and its neighbors better than in the past.

The club wants every one in the county to use these books as only through use can the library grow. A card may be secured from any Study Club member for the nominal sum of fifty cents. This card entitles the holder to read as many books or magazines as he cares to during one whole year.

We have a good supply of books now on hand and are planning to secure one or more circulating libraries, which will assure all subscribers a constant source of new and interesting books.
