FEDERAL OFFICERS RAID

Five federal prohibition officers made a raid of liquor joints in Giddings Thursday morning, and as a result much beer, whiskey and wine was destroyed and several slot machines were taken. Six white men and one Negro were taken to Austin Thursday afternoon to appear before the U. S. Commissioner. Those taken by the officers were Hm. Jank, A. Warnasch, Chas. Bittner, two Duncans and Alvin Bohot and Ernest Milton (colored). Milton was found at one of the places. Five separate places were raided, three in north Giddings and two in South Giddings and much evidence was found. At one place, ingredients for concocting high-class drinks was found, and some whiskey said the Scotch was found. The raid lasted from 10:30 to 2:30 and was made with search warrants.
