**NEGRO BOYS ATTEND
4-H CLUB ENCAMPMENT**

Eight Negro 4-H club boys accompanied by Negro County Agricultural Agent C. U. Westbrook, attended the regular three day South Central Texas Area 4-H encampment for 4-H club boys. More than 250 Club boys from Caldwell, Guadalupe, Lavaca, Fayette, Colorado and Lee counties gathered at the Luling Foundation Farm, Luling, Texas on the bank of the San Marcos river to enjoy the three day event. In connection

with the encampment a one day course was held, demonstrations were conducted in poultry, swine and dairy cattle. Swimming, boat rides, softball games, races, horse shoe pitching and barn yard mimic were among the feature events.

An area judging contest was held, the boys from Lee County made a very good showing as this was some of the boys first time to do any judging in public.
