

Giddings Voters Rename School Board, Wiese, and Namken; Elect Kaltwasser

Countywide School Results Are Not Yet Complete

Giddings voters Tuesday re-elected Mayor H. C. Wiese and Commissioner R. W. Namken for another two-year term apiece and elected Albert Kaltwasser to the City Commission. Mr. Kaltwasser replaces Ed. C. Hamff who was not re-elected. A total of 339 votes were cast.

Mr. Wiese, unopposed on the ballot, received 214 votes. E. A. Mutschink, a write-in candidate for the office of mayor, received 114 votes. Mr. Namken received 247 votes for commissioner, Mr. Kaltwasser 208, and Mr. Hamff 153. Two commissioners were to be elected.

In the school trustee election last Saturday in the Giddings Independent district the three incumbents, John T. Longley, Milton Tate, and R. W. Namken, were re-elected. Votes cast totaled 251. Mr. Longley received 193 votes, Mr. Namken 183, Mr. Tate 186, E. L. Kissman 81, E. G. Richter 88, John Kubsch 2, Aug. Kessel 1.

C. A. Hamff and Herbert Wachsmann, both unopposed, were re-elected to the county school board in Precincts 1 and 2 respectively.

Dime Box Rural High School District re-elected its complete board: Arnold Hannes, J. P. Stanley, Walter Helmer, F. M. Zwernemann, Fred Moerbe, Willie Kubena, and Henry Ondrasek.

Complete results of the elections held in the common school districts in the county were not available this week. Returns will have to be canvassed when the Commissioners Court meets Monday.
