The Ledbetter Gravel Company's new washer is now complete and the work is now going forward in full blast. The huge machine then carries the gravel to the conveyer, where it is treated to a spray of water in a revolving drum, which separates the clay and sand from the rock, passes it on to the screens, where it is sorted and placed in receptacles according to size. The largest rocks are sent back to the crusher and returned to the screens for sorting.
