

8th Annual Ledbetter Homecoming Sunday Features Varied Activities

All business suspends in Ledbetter next Sunday, June 11, to participate in the Eighth Annual Homecoming.

Organized in 1937 by a small meeting of natives and Ledbetter exes, the Homecoming was dedicated to the idea of affording an annual get-together day for all natives and their many friends, and to give all concerned an opportunity to pay dues and donations towards the upkeep of the Ledbetter Cemetery, one of the best maintained in the district. The affair was originally sponsored by the Cemetery Association, but because of its ever growing attend-

ance, all Ledbetter clubs are active participants.

The Homecoming proper begins at 10 o'clock morning on the hallowed note of reverent sentiment to our honored dead by an informal gathering at the cemetery, decoration of graves, introduction of new-comers, and concluding with a memorial address there by Hon. John S. Simmang, County Judge of Lee County.

The balance of the program will be at the new community center which features an all day barbecue of pork, beef and mutton, slated to be sold in any quantity by weight, together with free coffee and other barbecue trimmings during the noon meal. A brief business meeting will be held at 1:30 p. m., followed by an impromptu teacher-student program under the direction of Mrs. Leonie Weyand, teacher in the Beaumont High School. All Ledbetter ex-teachers will be honored with corsages bound with red ribbons, and will be paid other tributes appropriate to the day.

Along with ample varied refreshment, Bingo and other carnival games will be available afternoon and evening, but highlighting the afternoon and evening will be the baseball game between Lincoln and Ledbetter of the Lee ty League this season.

Concluding the affair will be a big dance at night, with Lee Ilse and his orchestra of La Grange making merry with modern and old time dance music, and all Ledbetter extends a hearty invitation to come out for participation.
