## Grass Fires

Firemen made a run down the highway west of town to extinguish a wind-fanned grass fire near the Hillview Farms at 1 a. m. Sunday morning. Another run was made to the Stuermer pasture along the highway 2 miles west of here at 5 a.m. Monday morning to quench a fiercely burning grass fire that threatened some 700 acres of pasture and woodland. Both fires presumedly originated from matches or smoldering cigarettes cast from passing cars

The deluges of late August and early Sept. caused a very lush growth of grass and vegetation which recent droughts and freezes have made tinder dry and highly inflammable, and the general public is cautioned to use extreme care with fires until the customary winter rains eliminate the fire hazard.

Star route carrier Albert Hannes reports that some 600 acres of grass on the Williams Farm was ablaze Monday morning along the mail route and that the Williams barn and all its contents were destroyed by the fire.
