Community Center Transferred

In accord with its original terms of purchase from the Ledbetter School District, the Ledbetter Cemetery Association transferred its ownership of the Community Center to the Ledbetter Fire Department, now an incorporated organization, for a sum equal to original cost, plus insurance expenses. The original dedication is a binding clause of the deed, which insured the perpetuation of the annual Homecoming, and the rights of other local clubs to use the Community Center with full cooperation of the Fire Department.
