## LEXINGTON AREA PLANS CUCUMBER PROGRAM

A contract with Texas Pickle Co. for the purchase of pickling size cucumbers at Lexington seemed assured from response of farmers at the meeting with C. M. Frazee, one of the owners of that concern at the Lexington School Tuesday night.

A group of more than twenty farmers attended the meeting and expressed themselves favorably on the program.

Mr. Frazee offered to guarantee to take all cucumbers raised during the pickling season at a fixed price to be delivered in Lexington. In addition the Texas Pickle Co. will supply the seed free.

The only obligation of the grower would be to agree not to sell any cucumbers to any other outlet. Growers would be permitted to can some of their produce for home use.

The Pickle company needs assurance that at least 40 acres of cucumbers will be planted here before they will assure pick-up of the cucumbers at Lexington.
