A place for everything was the topic Mrs. Herman Kleschnick discussed with the Lincoln 4-H Club at the school house April 25.

A built-in closet should be in every bed-room for each member of the family's clothing. These dimensions are suggested in making one. Height up to the ceiling, the upper part forming shelves, for storing articles not frequently used; width, as wide as space well permit; depth, 24 to 30 inches. A rod should extend the full length of the closet providing room for hanging all garments. Shelves spaced 10 to 12 inches apart, hat stands, shoe-racks, and laundry bags are very convenient.

A closet painted white or papered with light colored paper and ventilation keeps moths away.

For storing folded articles, newspapers make an excellent wrapping against moths for they dislike printer's ink.

Dresses and coats should hang in closet on wire or wood cloth-hangers protected by a dress bag made of three flour sacks. Cut three pieces of cloth to width of twenty-seven inches. One of them to be the front of the bag, is slashed up the middle to within six inches of the top. One slashed eage is faced back and the other has, an extending facing to form a pocked. Sew on snap fasteners at three-inch intervals. The top edges of the front and back are sloped down three inches to conform to the shape of the coat hanger, and are stitched leaving an inch-opening in the middle for the hook.

The third flour bag is folded in half along the twenty-seven inch width, and the long edges sewn to the bottom of the other two pieces. The sides are then stitched up and the bag is complete, except for the addition of a small pocket on the inside to bold a perfumed sachet or a few moth balls.
