

Post Oak Adults Learn to Sew

Three classes of adults and out of school youth have begun their first units of work for the school term. All groups chose to work on a unit "Selection and Construction of Clothing for the Family."

The groups have set up their goals and are well on their way to work. They meet one day each week at a chosen place in the community which is convenient to all who attend and where there is available cutting space and a sewing machine. Detailed instructions are given and individuals work as far as they can on the garment without help until the next meeting.

At present the classes are meeting in the homes of Susie Gantt, Effie Lynscum and Annie Kern. Plans are being made for two other classes, one to be held in the Homemaking Department at Post Oak School and the other at Willie Punchard's home. All groups have chosen to work with clothing.

This method of working with adults in different sections makes it possible for persons to attend class who do not have any means of transportation to the school for instructions. Groups met at the time most convenient for the group to be served.

Two classes will meet at 8:30 p. m. in the morning and others at 3 p. m. At the close of the units plans are made to style the garments made during a style review at the school with the hope of interesting other persons in such classes.
