Correspondence from Germany

Spremberg, February 11, 1906

A few lines from this part of Europe are being sent to the *Volksblatt* again, and they should be something of interest.

As the churches here in Germany have their schedules of holidays since from old times, the worldly entertainments are likewise scheduled. In January, there is the Bock Beer Festival and in February the Birthday of the Keiser, also in February the Masked Ball, which, in other places is held in March, and Easter in April. In May, there is the recruitment of the military. In June, there are different outdoor events such as car races, gymnastics, and various excursions. In July and August there is the Harvest Festival, and then the fairs in the fall.

The Prussian Government is again having its conflict with the Social Democrats. This party does no good for this world or for the world to come.

In Spremberg, there is a hog market on the first Wednesday of each month. The hogs here keep getting more expensive rather than cheaper, according to the *Spremberger Anzeiger*. Today, February 7, the market became more stable, but, despite all of this, pigs were higher than before. For 6 week-old pigs one paid 50 *Marks* for a pair and 30 *Marks* for 8 week old pigs each. *Laufers* of 100 pound weight brought 75 *Marks* each.

Up to now, we have had no stretch of cold weather and very little snow. Recently we had a light frost. Our larger cities are unhappy because they would like to have sleigh ride parties, but up to now, the snow at the most is 3 inches deep, so there are none. But sometimes they can have an ice rink.

N.B. The books that you sent to me have arrived safely, and they came at the right time, for in the long winter evenings I can make good use of them at the lonely post of the watchman. Many thanks. Greetings to all the readers.
