Correspondence from Germany (by Matheus Hantschko)

Family Home near Spremberg November 1, 1915

Dear Volksblatt Readers in distant Texas! The winter will be entering earlier here in Germany this year because we already had snow on the 28th of October which was not deep and has disappeared along with the cold temperature; it is warmer again, at present. We have also lost someone to a hero's death from the railroad organization in Spremberg: the 24year old private of the 64th Infantry Regiment, 12th Company, Hermann Goan from Bagenz; furthermore, musketeer of the 53rd Infantry Regiment, 3rd Company, Wilhelm Mager from Pumpe. The last named had relatives in Texas; if I'm not mistaken, in Winchester. The private, Georg Messer, was promoted to sergeant on October 11th. He received the Iron Cross second class at the same time. According to the October 29, 1915 issue of the "Spremberg Gazette," the following from the district of Spremberg died the hero's death for emperor and empire. Private Fritz Samisch from Goada, Musketeer Willy Wallbaum, Musketeer Emil Berger, Musketeer Richard Greiff, Musketeer Paul Jaisu, Landsturmmann Otto Paul Karchier and Wilhelm Fuchs from the 171st Infantry Regiment, all from Spremberg; Musketeer Reinhold Peschke and Rifleman Otto Mueller from Cantdorf, Reservist August Baltot from Selessen, Willi Heintze from Bagenz of the 12th Infantry Regiment.
