Kirschberger-Schkade Nuptials Solemnized

Miss Kathryn Martha Kirschberger became the bride of Raymond Charles Schkade in a formal ceremony Sunday evening, August 13, in Immanuel Lutheran Church. The Rev. Max Studtmann officiated at the double-ring service.

The bride is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. U. M. Kirschberger of Lamar, Arkansas. A graduate of Lamar High School, she attended St. John's Lutheran College, Winfield, Kansas, and has been employed the past year in Kansas City, Missouri.

The bridegroom is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Edmund Schkade of Giddings. He graduated from Concordia College Austin, received his Junior College Diploma from St. John's College, Winfield, Kansas, and after a further two years of study at Concordia Seminary in St. Louis, he received his B. A. Degree the past June.

Baskets of red and white gladioli, palms, and an altar arrangement decorated the chancel of the church.

Miss Elsie Lois Zabel, organist, played the nuptial music, and accompanied Mrs. Milton Schroeder, who sang "The

Lord's Prayer."

Mr. Kirschberger gave his daughter in marriage. Her gown was nylon marquisette, ending in a diluge of ruffles. The wide skirt extended into a formal train, edged with a wide ruffle. Her fingertip veil of imported nylon illusion was caught to a half crown of organdy encircled net. She carried a bouquet of white carnations and stephanotis, with white streamers.

She was attended by Miss Joyce Schkade, sister of the groom. Her bridesmaids were Miss Jeanette Zwernemann, Mrs. John Pomrenke and Miss Betty Winkler.

Her attendants wore all white gowns of imported Swiss organdy, with capelets of embroidered Swiss organdy. They wore crownless picture hats, trimmed with ruffles and a bow of matching organdy. Each carried a white fan made of plumes with red carnations and streamers.

The flower girl was Judy Schkade, cousin of the groom. Her dress was hooped, of the same material as the bridesmaids. Her hat and bouquet also was in accordance with the other attendants.

The ring bearer was Buddy Preuss, cousin of the groom.

Carl Kirschberger, brother of the bride, attended the groom as best man. Ushers were Marvin Tschatschula, Melvin Winkler, and Clarence Becker.

After the ceremony guests were received in the parish house. The bride's table was laid with lace cloth, decorated with white plume fans and red carnations at the candleholder vases. The wedding cake was of an original "altar" design, made by Mrs. M. A. Moerbe.
