Born October 5, 1914 to Hermann & Pauline Zschech. Was baptized and confirmed here at Trinity Lutheran Church. Entered the United States Army January 6, 1942. Assigned to L Company, 127th Infantry Regiment of the 32nd Red Arrow Division. Was mortally wounded on December 29, 1942 during the battle of Buna Mission, New Guinea, one of the first offensive campaigns of WWII to recover the south Pacific from the Japanese. Died on January 30, 1943, in route from Port Moresby, New Guinea to Brisbane, Australia and buried in the Coral Sea.
