Larry Wayne took sick on May 15, 1952. We took him to Brackenridge Hospital in Austin on May 17. There they made a spinal test and said he had polio. He was put in the iron lung on May 19. He stayed in the iron lung all the time for about two weeks. Then they started to take him out for a few minutes at a time. This was done several times a day. In about two weeks, he was out of the iron lung to stay. He was paralyzed from his head to his ankles. He was helpless and required a special nurse at all times.

They started Physio-Therapy as soon as he could stay out of the iron lung long enough. This was to bring his muscles back. This did a lot of good for Larry Wayne. But they don't have the equipment in Austin to give all the treatments he needed. He stayed in Austin seven weeks.

On July 7 we took him to Gonzales Warm Springs Foundation. There he got more Physio-Therapy and was fitted with splints for his legs, a left hand splint, shoes and corsets. His improvement was wonderful.

On September 13 he was dismissed from Gonzales Warm Springs Foundation. He still goes back for checkups. But he is able to walk without braces or crutches. He is doing fine now. If there is any place they can do anything for polio patients, it is at Gonzales Warm Springs Foundation. It is a wonderful place. We hope with God's help, Larry Wayne will get completely well.

Yes, this all takes lots of money, because polio treatments are very expensive. We had polio insurance. It paid part of our bill in Austin, but we had a good sized bill the insurance did not pay. The insurance paid all bills in Gonzales.

So, this is where the local chapter comes in. It sure is a friend in need. They paid our bill in Aus-



tin which was some over \$1,200.00, for which we are very grateful. We hope that anybody that needs help will call on the local chapter, because they are a friend in need. You see, we know.

We wish to thank everybody for their help while Larry Wayne was in the hospitals. We also wish to thank the local chapter. We hope that everybody will remember and give to the March of Dimes which started January 2, 1953. Give and pray to God you will not need help. But the local chapter will help those who need help.
