According to George C. Engerrand in his May 1, 1934 manuscript entitled "The So-called Wends of Germany and Their Colonies in Texas and in Australia," Wends are described as "kindly, friendly, brotherly, our Wend was essentially gregarious. He liked to feel around him the warmth due to the presence of other men. Social gatherings appealed to him, and every occasion for a frolic, for singing in common, sound laughing, and the exchange of pleasantries was seized upon with eagerness."

The Texas Wendish Heritage Society and Museum have become important, very respected keepers of a special cultural heritage in Texas. From the time it was founded in August of 1971 by a determined group of women, the Society and Museum have grown to preserve both tangible and intangible treasures for future generations.

Many people of Wendish heritage have faithfully supported the Society through untold hours of volunteer service on a myriad of projects.
