

Teacher Schultz Of Houston Observes 40. Anniversary

Teacher Emil Schultz of Houston recently observed his 40th. anniversary in the teaching profession. The occasion was marked by a special service of thanksgiving in Trinity Lutheran Church of Houston where he served as teacher of the Christian Day School the past 40 years.

Mr. Schultz was born in Fedor, Lee County, Texas, and attended the Christian Day School of St. Paul's Lutheran Church at Thornedale to which place his parents had moved to after leaving Fedor.

After his confirmation he attended Concordia Teachers College at Seward Nebraska and after his

graduation in June 1913 he was called to Houston and was installed there by the Rev. J. W. Behnken.

At that time there was only 1 Christian Day School in Houston, now there are 16 such schools in the City. Besides serving as principal of Trinity Lutheran School the past 36 years, Mr. Schultz was chairman of the State Teacher's Conference and served on various boards of the Synod.

When Mr. Schultz married Miss Johanna in 1913 he was blessed with a wife who has shared the labors of his work. The family circle includes Erwin, Ruth (Mrs. Victor Buvinghausen), Dorothy, (Mrs. George Geyer), and Lloyd.

Teacher Schultz is faithful to the smallest detail of his calling, has a deep and abiding love for his pupils, and a child-like faith in his Savior. May God grant him grace and continue to bless his work in School and Church.
