Letter from Germany

Schleife, April 15, 1923.

It was cold and dry here on the Friday of Easter. The barn in Slamen, which belonged to the hotel owner Schwetasch of Spremberg, burned down at 3 o'clock on Good Friday. We had warm weather the whole week before Easter. It was cold on Easter Sunday with winds from the north-east which lasted the whole week. The Sunday after Easter was also very cold. The Spremberg Gazette wrote the following concerning the weather in April. A segment for copy and timely contemplation is offered by Ernst Heiter. A nice thunderstorm with rain, on April 14, followed 4 long weeks of dryness. Mushrooms, the so-called morels, are growing now. Morels grow in April but not during the summer.

The spring came into this land and has colored the fields in order to begin it's process and we are now into April, initially in good spirits, and then April displayed its freakish mindset by turning less sunny, but still trying to be pleasing, as it moved into the land..

Thus, in the beginning, the month presented itself very pleasantly but such is only superficial because the time dictates glumness and even if, in the breeze of spring, the fields are renewed, the times are still critical for economy and politics.

The morning red of peace is not to be seen on the horizon and the economic needs remain lingering and, those who look hopefully at prices are sent back into April as there are too many zeroes, as in winter.
