Wagner-Bage Vows Pledged in Double Ring Ceremony at Immanuel Lutheran Church

Miss Anita Wagner, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Arthur Wagner, became the bride of Henry H. Bage, Sunday evening, Sept. 10, in a double-ring ceremony performed at the Immanuel Lutheran Church.

The Rev. Paul C. Eifert of Warda officiated.

Mrs. Henry Stroebel played the traditional wedding marches. Mrs. Milton Schroeder, soloist, sang the Wedding Song at the beginning of the ceremony, and the 23rd Psalm at the close of the sermonette. The sermonette was based on the text of

Ruth.

The bride entered on the arm of her father. She was gowned in white slipper satin, with pointed bodice and lace yoke, edged with seed pearls and rhinestones. The skirt was gathered, ending with overlapping lace and satin ruffles and a long train edged with a lace ruffle. The finger-tip veil of illusion edged with lace was attached

to a tiara of lace and orange blossoms. She carried a bouquet of white chrysanthemums and carnations. Her only jewelry was a pair of pearl earbobs, a gift from the bridegroom.

Mrs. Ted Kilian, sister of the bride, was matron of honor. She wore a full length dress of white taffeta with matching gauntlets and headdress and carried a bouquet of orchid asters.
